Languages, Literacy & Communication

Oracy skills, phonic work Letters and Sounds. Nelson handwriting scheme. Hot seating – Where do we live? Facts about Caerphilly: Then and now. Reading non-fiction books about Wales. Describing places in Wales through pictures. Research -The Four Nations that make up the United Kingdom.

Countries: Look at other countries outside of Wales e.g.
France, Greece, USA, Mexico, Australia. Letter writing, diary,
description, poetry about different countries.
Non-fiction texts.

Mathematics & Numeracy

Counting, reading and writing numbers.

Place value: Greater than and less than given numbers. Counting forwards and backwards: one more, one less, numbers in words. Count objects up to 100, partitioning numbers, read and write numbers to 100. Count in 1', 2's and 10's. Count in 3's. Compare objects/numbers

Addition and subtraction – use of number lines, hopping on and back. Fact families, add by making 10, add to the next ten, compare number sentences.

Shape: 2D and 3D shapes: naming shapes, creating pictures Count sides on 2D shapes, count vertices. Look at lines of symmetry. Count faces, edges, vertices on 3D shapes. Make patterns with both 2D and 3D shapes

Ingredients, weighing. Discuss healthy, unhealthy foods.

Dance: Welsh Country Dancing

Gymnastics: PESS shapes, leading to gymnastic sequences.

<u>Dance:</u> Welsh country dancing. Making comparisons with other popular known dances.

<u>Gymnastics:</u> PESS shapes. Develop partner work, sequences and performing. Film short sequences.

<u>Drama</u>: Hot seating, acting out stories related to the theme/role play. Christmas concert for parents. Role play areas in classrooms to develop individual roles.
